The Bradley Lowery Foundation was established in August 2017 after Bradley lost his fight to Neuroblastoma, a rare and aggressive form of childhood cancer.

The campaign was very successful and with the support of thousands of people, we managed to raise over £1.3m, as well as raising vital awareness for Neuroblastoma and childhood cancer in general.

The charity has been established for nearly 5 years, and we have raised in excess of £6.5 Million for campaigns. We have supported children to get treatment abroad, built extensions, sensory rooms, purchased specialised equipment and much more.

When Brad was on Earth, he always wanted to help other children. He was caring and compassionate and this is reflected in the values the charity has adopted in his name.

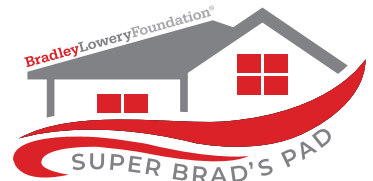
Our Everyday Work

The Bradley Lowery Foundation was set up to support families to raise funds for treatment or equipment not currently available on the NHS.

This support includes emotional support, help running social media campaigns, support with organising fundraising events and planning trips for families who are travelling abroad for treatment.

Research

Since starting the charity in 2017, the Bradley Lowery Foundation has donated £245,000 into childhood cancer research. This includes £200,000 to Neuroblastoma research, £15,000 into DIPG and £15,000 into Ewing's Sarcoma.

Children's cancer research is incredibly underfunded, so it is very important to us to help fund this much needed research to find better and safer treatments for our children.
